Rehabilitation Assistants are employed by Therapy/Rehabilitation Services and provide rehabilitation care to clients in the facility and/or community setting. Rehabilitation Assistants carry out rehabilitation programs following the assessment, program development and delegation of intervention by a Therapist with the goal to rehabilitate, maintain and optimize the client's physical quality of life. The Rehabilitation Assistant is directly supervised by the Therapist for the care and continuity of the client's program in the facility and/or community.

The Rehabilitation Assistant is a member of a multidisciplinary team whose intervention services may be provided in a Prairie Mountain Health (PMH) facility, the client's home, and community environment and/or during the transition of care from acute care to the home setting. Services provided may include but are not limited to basic personal care, rehabilitation, and in the home environment; supports for the client that are aimed at helping clients increase their level of mobility, independence with activities of daily living, community re-integration and maximize the client's safety in their home/community to maintain the client in the home setting for as long as possible.

Qualifications

- Graduate of a recognized Rehabilitation Assistant course, Occupational Therapy Assistant course or Physiotherapy Assistant course.
- Recent relevant recognized education and/or experience preferred.
- Demonstrated problem solving and organizational skills.
- Demonstrated communication skills both through verbal and written communication.
- > Demonstrated flexibility to facilitate changes in techniques and procedures.
- > Demonstrated physical ability to lift and participate in client lifts and/or transfers.
- Ability to accurately identify changes in clients.
- Ability to work independently and/or with minimal supervision.
- Ability to work collaboratively within a multidisciplinary team.
- Knowledge and ability to work with computer software programs.
- Ability to respect and promote a culturally diverse population.
- Ability to perform duties of the position on a regular basis.
- Province of Manitoba Class 5 Driver's License and access to a personal vehicle to provide service within the Prairie Mountain Health.
